BREAKOUT SESSIONS DESCRIPTION

Growing a Thriving Singles Ministry

With many churches having large numbers of singles in their congregations, how do you minister to singles effectively, address their specific needs and galvanize them to work in ministry and achieve purpose?

This session is suitable for senior and associate pastors and heads of singles ministries.

Church and Public Relations

Are there ways to educate the public about what the church is really about and change negative mindsets about the church? How should the church engage Public Relations tools and agencies to shine our light?

This session is suitable for senior pastors and heads of ministries charged with managing communications and public relations.

Managing Volunteers for Growth and Effectiveness

How do you balance effective operations and spiritual maturity in your volunteers? It's important to manage your volunteers' energies, time, and ensure they are being fulfilled while serving God.

This session is suitable for heads of ministries and small groups.

Creating a Wow Service Experience.

This session will address issues relating to good customer service, event flow, planning, execution and creating a conducive atmosphere for the Holy Spirit to flow.

This session is suitable for production managers, heads of ministries and service managers.

Church Budgeting and Financial Management.

As good stewards, how should you plan for projects, manage cash flow and report church financials?

This session is suitable for pastors in charge of finance and senior accountants.

Church Administration.

This session deals with managing strategy, structures (procurement, HR management, facility), and general church operations.

This session is suitable for senior pastors and church administrators.

Pastoring People Groups

Every church has mixed demographics - young, elderly, married, single, widowed, previously married, single parents, mature singles and several other situations. How do you effectively lead and pastor these particular people groups?

This session is suitable for senior and associate pastors and heads of relevant people groups.

In this session, we share TEC model for birthing and executing campaigns and events.
This session is suitable for pastors, creative and program directors and project and event managers.

Community Impact: A Must for Every Church

The local church must impact its community for good. This session will detail ways to spearhead community initiatives on both small and large scales for impact and evangelism.

This session is suitable for worship leaders and pastors.

Leading a Thriving Junior Church

A successfully run junior church can be your strongest attraction proposition. What structures, processes and policies must be in place to run successful children's ministries (from pre-school to the teens church).

This session is suitable for pastors, children's church pastors, administrators and teen church leaders.

Touching Lives Through Small Groups

As your church grows numerically, it becomes easy for people to hide in the crowd. This means they don't mature in Christ and also their needs don't get met. For a church to feel like a family people need to interact in circles not rows.

This session is suitable for pastors and small group leaders.



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Your Ministry and The Law

Be aware of the regulatory requirements and the legal framework that affect the operations of your church and ministry. E.g. employments, incorporation and tax laws?

This session is suitable for senior pastors, chief operating officers and senior church administrators.

Managing Building Projects

What kind of structure is best suited for your church or ministry? Learn how to plan, raise funds, execute and navigate government approvals for building projects.

This session suitable for senior pastors and senior church administrators.

Preaching that Connects

How do you plan your sermons? Are there ways to aid presentation and understanding when preaching? How do you get your sermons to stick?

This session is suitable for pastors and teachers.

Advertising & Publicity

You've planned a great program, how do you get people's feet in the door? What are the strategies churches can employ in advertising or publicizing programs and events? How do you leverage social and new media for advertising?

This session is suitable for pastors, communications directors, event managers and social media managers.

Rudiments of Church Planting

What are the things to look out for when starting a new church plant or a new branch or extension of your church? When is it time to break into branches? What operational models exist for multi-site churches?

This session is suitable for senior pastors, evangelists and church planters.

Leading When You're not in Charge (Strictly for Associate Pastors)

The associate pastor role is such an integral one in the ministry. You're not the visionary but you're the man or the woman supporting the vision. How do you best support the vision of the senior pastor? How do you lead up? How do you ensure ego doesn't get in the way? How do you become a helper not a hindrance?

This session is strictly for associate pastors.
